## CONTEXT

The MRC du Golfe-du-Saint-Laurent and the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing signed an agreement on April 22, 2021, within the Regions and Rurality Fund, component 4 with a goal to realize projects and initiatives aimed at supporting the vitalization of the MRC's territory.

## OBJECTIVES of the agreement:

- To encourage the mobilization of elected officials and municipal administrations to address specific vitalization challenges.
- To promote collaboration between the regional government apparatus, the organization and local municipalities and Aboriginal communities facing these challenges.
- To support the implementation of vitalization initiatives within the organization's territory.
- To positively affect the vitality of the territory by improving services or facilities for the population by carrying out projects that are economically, socially, tourism or culturally significant.
